

# History of Riverstone International School

Riverstone International School was established in 1997 under the name Hidden Springs Community School. The mission of the school was to provide students in the Treasure Valley with a quality, independent education. The founding trustees were Jim Grossman, developer of the community of Hidden Springs, and Sam Hazard, founder, and former Head of the Community School of Sun Valley. The school opened its doors with 57 students enrolled in kindergarten through eighth grade.

It did not take long for word to spread about the School and its offerings. In 1998, the beginnings of the Upper School, grade nine, was established. In just three years, enrollment doubled. In 2000, the School moved from Dry Creek Valley to southeast Boise and changed its name to Riverstone Community School. The School was housed in an old Forest Service building and three modular buildings that were built by the School. By the fall of 2001 enrollment had increased to 130 and an additional building was added. The School was accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges and Universities (NASCU) and the State of Idaho. In that same year the School approached the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) to begin the rigorous authorization process that would permit the School to offer the revered IB Diploma Program. This required adding grades ten through twelve to the Upper School.

In the 2002-2003 school year, grade ten was added and enrollment reached 170. Wanting to develop a global student body, the School's first international exchange students arrived in 2002. These students came from Russia, Thailand, Germany, Brazil, Spain, Chile, and Colombia. The School dedicated itself to completing a full Upper School with a college preparatory curriculum culminating with the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program in the final two years of Upper School (high school). By 2003, the School's enrollment increased to 235 students, including nineteen international students. Eleventh grade was added, additional property was secured, and the School broke ground on a new elementary school.


Grade twelve was added in 2004 and the IB Diploma Program was authorized for grades eleven and twelve. In 2005, the School became an accredited member of the Pacific Northwest Association of Independent Schools (PNAIS), which later changed its name to the Northwest Association of Independent Schools (NWAIS). In the same year, the School's second graduating class became the first recipients of an IB Diploma in the State of Idaho. The School changed its name to Riverstone International School in 2006.

In 2009, Riverstone was granted authorization to offer the Primary Years Program and Middle Years Program and began offering dual languages, Spanish and English, in full day preschool. In 2016, the School opened its Residential Program to expand efforts to attract international students and develop a global student body. Early in the 2021-22 school year, Riverstone's enrollment topped 400 for the first time.

Riverstone International School is an IB World School and offers all three IB Program: the Primary Years Program (PYP), Middle Years Program (MYP), and the Diploma Program (DP).

Riverstone will celebrate its 25th anniversary in the 2022-23 school year.


